Afforestation Projects at Asthi Paharh and at Ananda Nagar

Few words about the implementation of "Ultra Dense Forest Project" in Ananda Nagar Asthi Paharh:

Purpose of Ultra Dense Forest Project:

Due to very low rainfall in the Western Rarh, there is very little forest with vast empty land. Most of the government forest lands, hills and common lands are bare lands without trees. The consciousness and mentality of planting trees among the common people of the locality is very insignificant, almost nil. But it is true that if the number of trees increases, the rainfall in this region will increase.

Site selection for Ultra dense forestation in Ananda Nagar:

In Ananda Nagar, Srii Srii Anandamurtiji has given plan to establish various types of sanctuaries, ecofriendly orchards (PASKAS), fruit orchards and gardens. He also gave the same for Asthi Paharh too. When our senior Anandamargii and Grihii Acarya Sri Kisen Singh Sood Dadaji proposed to me for Ultra dense forestation project in Ananda Nagar and asked me to identify the land, also he said that he wanted to do the same in a modern scientific way. Naturally, I was overjoyed to hear starting of such a social development project in Ananda Nagar. Among the many places in the Ananda Nagar, I chose the land adjacent to the Asthi Paharh in the first list. Because its future is very bright, there are more possibilities and opportunities.

Naming of the Asthi Paharh:

This Asthi Paharh is located in Abhedananda Dihi. Only the name of the hill is Asthi Paharh. BABA went to Avhedananda Dihi on December 27, 1980, where he discovered dinosaur fossils. BABA went up the hill and sat on the rock and discovered dinosaur fossils. He named the place where the dinosaur fossils were found as "Asthi Paharh".

Sacrifice:

Ananda Nagar has a special glory in the whole world. BABA has mentioned that many times. His dream of Ananda Nagar has been built through the sacrifices of many devotees. This Abhedananda Dihi project has also been repeatedly attacked by evil forces. Specially a brutal attack came on Acarya Anirban Brahmhacari, a young ascetic monk, at the Avhedananda Dihi Ashram on September 29, 1997 at 11 pm. CPM thugs brutally hacked him to death to stop the development work of Anandamarga forever.

Why is the Asthi Paharh first on the list for Ultra Dense Forest Project?

- 1) Its natural location is very beautiful. Khirkhira hills on two sides i.e. west and north, plain land on the south. A little to the southeast is the Belamu Hills, the oldest decaying mountain in the world.
- 2) Our Abhedananda Dihi is at one of the ends of the Ananda Nagar border on the west side. Here we have Jagriti, one school and a monk also posted at our Ashram.
- 3) There is a huge lake near the Asthi Paharh.
- 4) There are no other plants in the Asthi Paharh except some shrubs.
- 5) As there were no trees, the open hills were rapidly eroding with the passage of time in the sun rays, rain and storms.
- 6) Generally, if there are enough plants, trees the environment will be soft and the erosion of the mountains can be prevented.
- 7) It will also be convenient to practice Tantra Sadhna here.
- 8) It will become an attractive tourist destination for devotees, visitors and travellers.

Preparation of Intensive Forestry and Tree Planting:

The hill and the adjoining area are about 15 acres. First of all, the soil has been tested from the government laboratory. The place was dug with JCB four months before the rains. Because, the soil will not be able to hold water, if it is not made loosen. After digging the land, arrangements have been made to increase the fertility and excellence of the land with adequate amount of straw, leaves and dung manure. Government departments and private body were contacted for the seedlings. But after making sure promises, they finally refused to give it. As an alternative, twenty thousand seedlings of twenty species compatible with the local environment have been procured from a private nursery in Medinipur. In addition the owner of the nursery donated 3,000 different saplings of 3 to 6 feet height for free with the great purpose of encouraging, managing and preparing our forestation project. Different species of trees have been planted in rows blocks of one square meter. In addition to the Panchabati trees such as Bell, Amalaki, Neem, Shimul, and any one of Bot or Ashwath, saplings of Shal, Pia Shal, Mahogany, Chatim, Bakul, Krishnachura, Mango, Jackfruit, Almond etc. have been planted. During the planting of saplings by the infinite grace of the Supreme father it rained daily. At the entrance of the ashram, Bakul, Shibali, Parijat, Mango, Jackfruit, Sabeda etc. have been planted as avenue trees.

Overcoming Adversity:

Arrangements were made to bring saplings from Medinipur in two matador vehicles. A vehicle was able to reach the ashram properly. The other one came near the ashram and while turning the wheel got stuck on the soft ground on the side of the road. The vehicle had to be pulled up with a tractor. The second problem is that the road to the asthi paharh is already bad and very slippery during the rainy season. As a result, the saplings have to be kept in other place of our ashram at Banshgarh. From there the saplings had to be taken to the asthi paharh by tractor. So, some seedlings have been damaged due to repeated lifting and lowering.

Maintenance:

- 1) Areas are being fenced to protect the seedlings from the cattle like Goats, sheep, cows and buffaloes.
- 2) Irrigation will be provided from two wells of the ashram and reservoirs if necessary.

- 3) Pumps and pipes, electric wires have been arranged for irrigation.
- 4) There are two guards organized by the Anandamarga Farm department for day and night. Moreover, Achrya Shubhamoy Brahmacari Dada is in charge of the ashram and is taking necessary care of the plants.
- 5) Acharya Devpremananda Avadhut Dada, Dit Secretary who has completed the process of planting saplings with devotion. Under his sincere supervision, this dense forest project is going to be implemented.

Second Dense Forest Project:

Dakshin Anandnagar is the south of Baba Memorial. Acarya Kalyaneshwarananda Avadhut Dada's long and untiring efforts have created forests here on about five acres of land. This time, one thousand cashew nuts saplings have been planted in three more acres of land in a scientific manner. The entire maintenance is being taken care of by the dada himself.


Third Dense Forest Project:

"Rambutan Compound" is in Guridi Mouza. About two and a half thousand different species of trees and five hundred cashew nuts saplings have been planted there. Acharya Devpremananda Avadhut Dada is also supervising this project regularly. There is a forest of different species of trees on about ten acres of land.








Ananda Marga Activities in ISRN's Newsletter
